Botanical Description:

It is a perennial herb, semi-aquatic, indefinitely branched. The rhizome is cylindrical, indefinitely branched, smooth pinkish to pale green, and has a stout joint with a large leaf scar. The rhizome is wrinkled, aromatic, and hairy. The leaves are few, alternate, reed-like, green, form erect tufts, and also have fragrance. The flowers are situated in little white groups.

Flowering/ Fruiting: April-August.

Part Used: Rhizome, roots.

Cultivation: Wild. Longitude: 76°35'21"E. Latitude: 31°37'47"N.

Altitude: 845m.






Fig. 4.3 Economic potential of *Acorus calamus* in comparison to conventional crops
