Herb, underground stem called bulb; bulb gives rise to clusters of leaves; leaves are fleshy and have parallel venation; Leaves are long, fleshy, bluish green, hollow, cylindrical; the leaf base is a white sheath; roots are fibrous; the peduncle is green in colour; the inflorescence is an umbel of white flowers; the flowers are white; bracteates are pedicelate; the pedicel is small; there are six tepals and two whorls; the fruit is a locullicidal capsule; and the seeds are endospermic.




Fig. 4.7 Economic potential of *Allium cepa* in comparison to conventional crops
