Erect, spiny, deciduous shrub, woody plant with yellow to brown, furrowed and rough bark, three-branched thorn, leaves in tuft, green, simple, stalked, elliptical to ovate, sharp-toothed branched, yellow flower, fruits ovoid, greyish-white, acidic, succulent, single large seed, yellow to pink single seed.

Flowering/ Fruiting: May-June/August-September.

Part Used: Fruit, root bark (locally known as rasaont, wood).

**Longitude:** 76°50'31"E. **Latitude:** 31°34'35"N.

Altitude: 1202m.




Fig. 4.17 Economic potential of *Berberis aristata* in comparison to conventional crops
