Botanical Description:

Herbaceous, annual, short Leaves long, petiolated, toothed, hairy, lobed, alternate, rarely opposite, stem soft, round, leaves and buds are edible, flowers yellow, cruciform, small, grow in spike, clusters of 5-10 flowers, seed pods, having 4-5 rounded seed, seeds, brown to red.

Flowering/ Fruiting: January-March.

Part Used: leaves, flowers, seeds.

Cultivation: Cultivated by few people only.

Longitude: 76°04'46"E.

Latitude: 31°37'47"N.

Altitude: 495m.

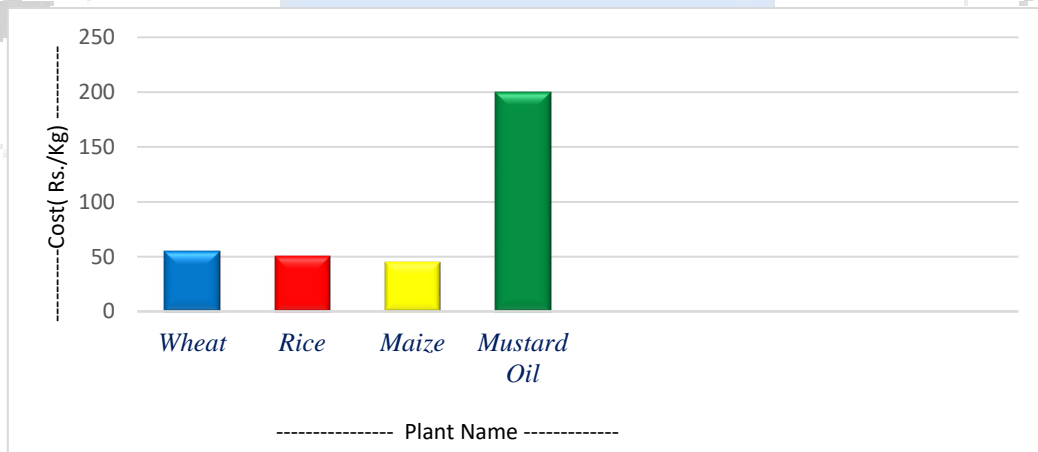


Fig. 4.20 Economic potential of *Brassica campestris* in comparison to conventional crops
