Common/Local Name (s): Kapoor, Karpura, Camphor Tree, Muski Kapoor, Chandrahba, Chandraprabha.

Family: Lauraceae.

Botanical Description:

Evergreen, Large, evergreen, broad-leaved, bark is rough, yellow-brown, having fissures; leaves are simple, alternate, bright green, glossy, waxy, and have a strong aromatic smell when crushed; flowers are bisexual, terminal panicles, yellow-white in colour; fruit is round, dark green when unripe; one seed is purple-blackish; they occur in clusters. Seeds are very small.

Flowering/ Fruiting: April-May.

Part Used: Leaves, fruits, inflorescence.

Cultivation: Wild.

Longitude: 76°24'49" E.

Latitude: 31°44'22" N.

Altitude: 560m.

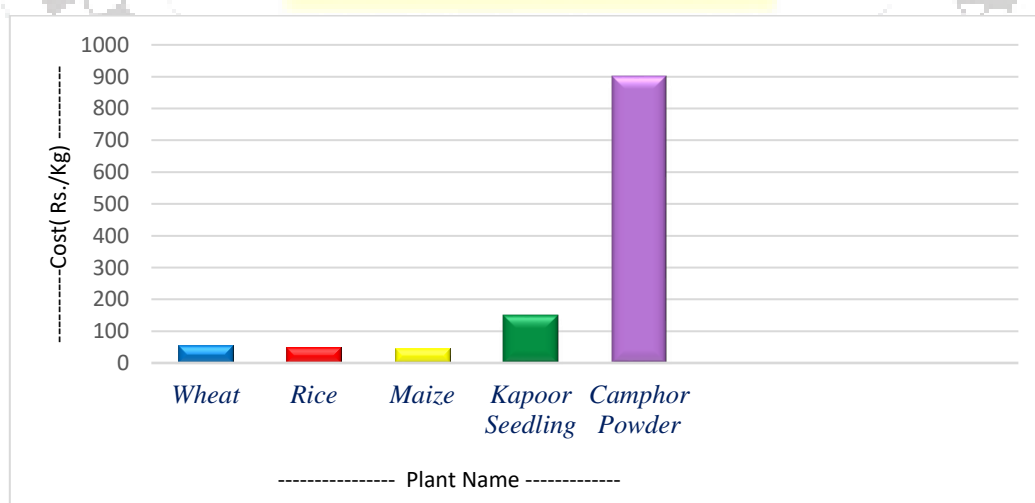


Fig. 4.30 Economic potential of *Cinnamomum camphora* in comparison to conventional crops
