
Citrus maxima (Burm.) Merr.

Botanical Description:

Perennial, crooked trunk, low and irregular branches, spiny and hairy branchlets, leaves dull green, glossy and wide, ovate to elliptical, flowers may be single or in clusters, axillary in position, fragrant, yellow-white in colour, fruit round, pulp colour may be pale yellow to pinkish, flavour varies from sweet to acidic, seeds are few, yellow-white.

Flowering/ Fruiting: March-May/ July-September.

Part Used: Leaves, fruits.

Cultivation: Wild. Longitude: 76°28'23"E. Latitude: 31°44'26"N.

Altitude: 722m.






Fig. 4.33 Economic potential of *Citrus maxima* in comparison to conventional crops
