Botanical Description:

Deciduous, bark brownish-grey, leaves small, green, alternate, numerous, petiolated, flowers are yellow, small, long stalked, below leaves, axillary, fruits pale yellow, spherical, pulpy, globular, smooth, six on surface, dry fruit grey to black, three shelled, two seeds.

Flowering/ Fruiting: February-May/ December – March.

Part Used: Fruit and Seeds.

Cultivation: Wild.

Longitude: 76°44'13"E.

Latitude: 31°25'04"N.

Altitude: 616m.

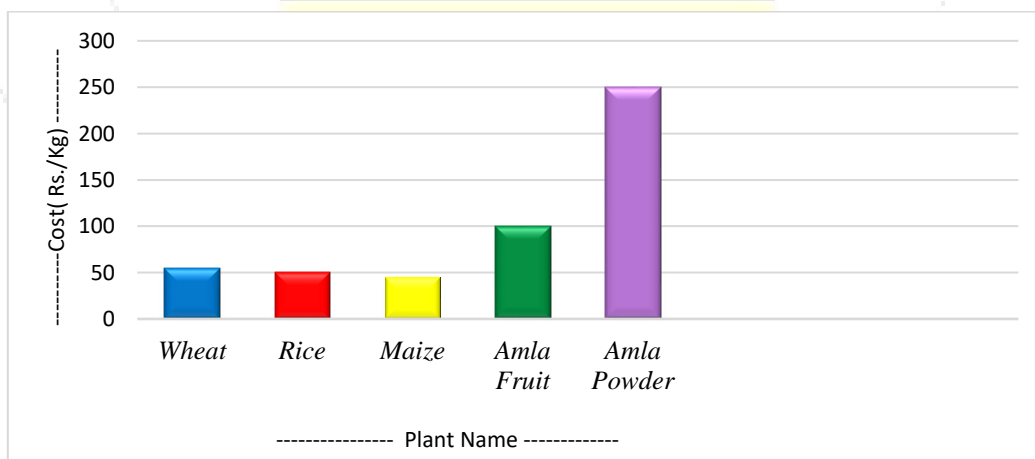


Fig. 4.43 Economic potential of *Emblica officinalis* in comparison to conventional crops
