Large, tall, perennial, highly branched tree, umbrella-shaped crown, bark is rough, dark brown, fissured, leaves are simple, alternate, green, but young leaves are reddish, oblong-lanceolate, leathery, prominent midrib, margin entire and wavy, aromatic, flowers are many, whitish-pinkish, fruit is irregularly shaped, fleshy drupe, outer skin is smooth, bear at proximal end, unripe is green and yellow-reddish when ripe, juicy, edible, seed is single, large with numerous hairs.

Flowering/ Fruiting: May-June/July-August. **Part Used:** Bark, leaves, fruit, pulp and kernels.

Cultivation: Wild.




Fig. 4.64 Economic potential of *Mangifera indica* in comparison to conventional crops
