Common/Local Name (s): Laung, Clove.

Family: Myrtaceae.

Botanical Description:

Medium-sized, evergreen plant; all plant parts (bark, leaves, and flowers) are aromatic; branches are numerous and semi-erect; leaves are glabrous; glands are on the lower surface; flowers are small, crimson flowers in terminal clusters; peduncle has 3–4 flowers at the end; fruit is olive type; only one seed; dries brown; and unopened flower buds form cloves.

Flowering/ Fruiting: February-May.

Part Used: Fruit.

Cultivation: Wild.

Longitude: 76°37'15"E.

Latitude: 31°36'27"N.

Altitude: 1017m.

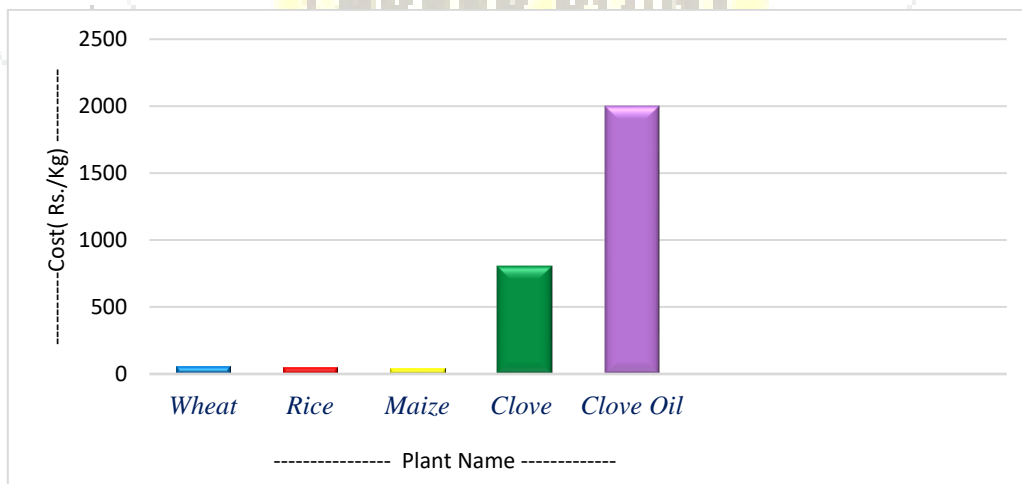


Fig. 4.88 Economic potential of *Syzygium aromaticum* in comparison to conventional crops
