Botanical Description:

Large perennial, evergreen tree, bark brownish, vertical fissures make bark rough, leaves are alternate, long, slender, compound, leaflets are opposite, sessile, oblong, margin entire, flowers are small, yellowish with reddish pink dots, fruit is a curved pod, oblong, wall crustaceous, seeds hard, 3-7, brown, compressed, enclosed in brown pulp.

Flowering/ Fruiting: April-June /December-March.

Part Used: Leaves, fruit and seeds.

Cultivation: Wild.

Longitude: 76.3641 E.

Latitude: 31.3947 N.

Altitude: 928m.

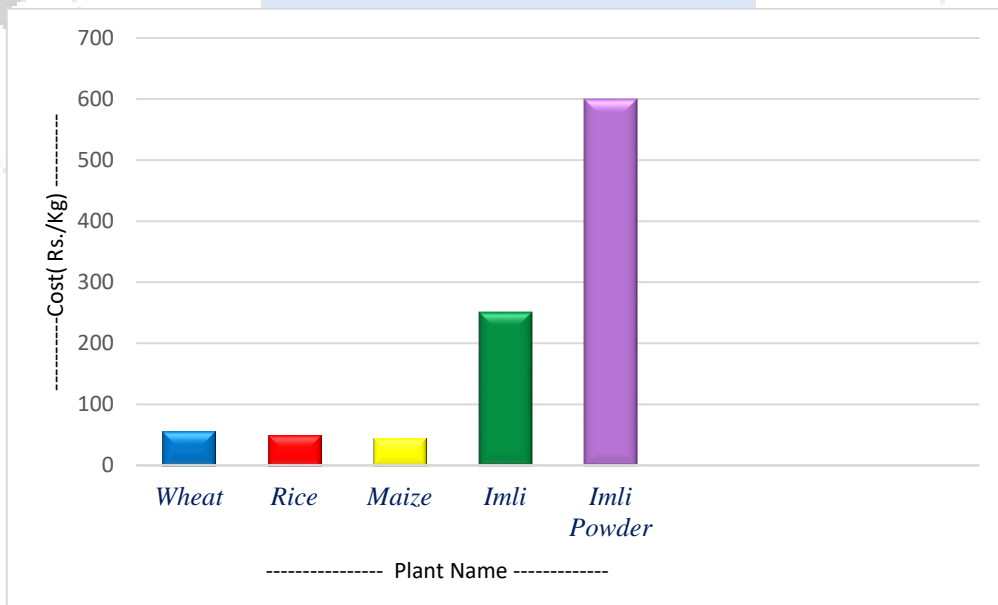


Fig. 4.90 Economic potential of *Tamarindus indica* in comparison to conventional crops
