Family: Combretaceae.

Botanical Description:

Large, evergreen, deciduous tree with smooth, thick, grey-coloured bark, a spreading crown, drooping branches, leaves that are dull green, simple, opposite, oblong or elliptic, oblong, conical, flowers that are sessile, occur axillary in simple or paniced spikes, cup-shaped, pale yellow to whitish in colour, fruit is dark brown, fibrous woody drupe, winged nut, five leathery projecting wings, tan-coloured when dry.

Flowering/ Fruiting: April-June/January-March

Part Used: Bark, leaves, stem, fruits.

Cultivation: Wild.

Longitude: 76°35'48"E.

Latitude: 31°38'09"N.

Altitude: 909m.

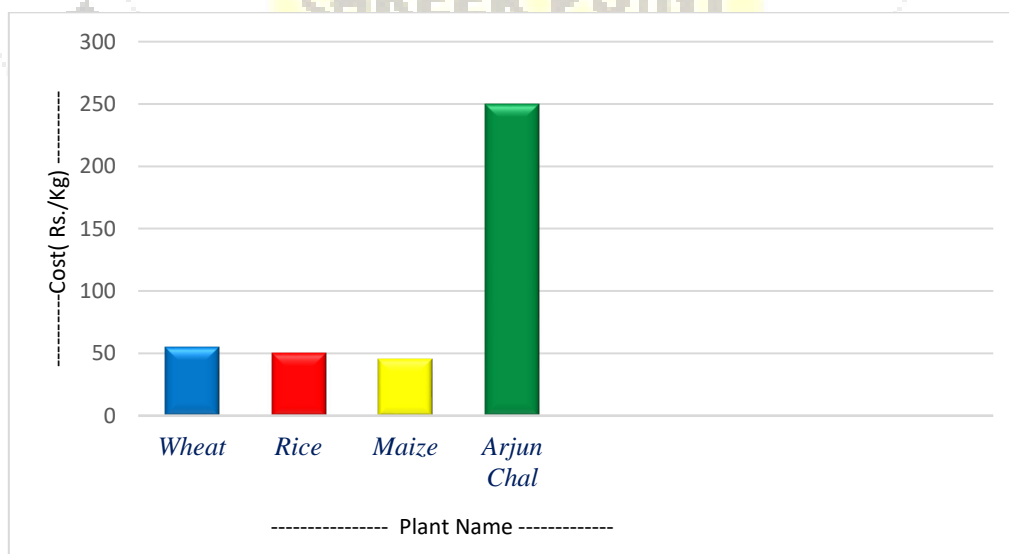


Fig. 4.91 Economic potential of *Terminalia arjuna* in comparison to conventional crops
