Perennial, deciduous, tall tree, round crown, spreading branches, bark is dark brown, leaves are green, simple, opposite to alternate, petiolate, ovate to elliptical, margin entire, flowers are aromatic, dull white to yellow, occur in terminal spikes, fruit is a drupe, woody, green smooth when young, turn brown-black on dry, have 5 lines on the outer skin, single seeded.

Flowering/ Fruiting: May-June/ July-December.

Part Used: Leaves, fruits.

Cultivation: Wild.

**Longitude:** 76°40'43"E. Latitude: 31°14'50"N. Altitude: 676m.




Fig. 4.92 Economic potential of *Terminalia chebula* in comparison to conventional crops
