Plant is erect, perennial, leaves are green, ovate to elliptic, acute, margin entire, petiolate, flowers are sessile to sub sessile, greenish-yellow, occur in clusters, 3-5 together, fruit berries are enclosed in inflated, enlarged, five-angled capsules, turn red on maturity, and seeds are many enclosed in pulp, yellow to brown.

Flowering/ Fruiting: June-November.

Part Used: Mainly roots but also leaves and seeds.

Cultivation: Wild. Longitude: 76°44'38"E. Latitude: 31°22'21"N.

Altitude: 655m.




Fig. 4.100 Economic potential of Withania somnifera in comparison to conventional crops
