QUALITY EDUCATION

The University is continuously striving to create trained human force through its various under graduate degree programmes to enlarge the pool of trained manpower in the state of Himachal Pradesh, India. More than one thousand graduate students have been admitted in 2022-23 out of whom nearly fifty per cent have gained requisite teaching qualification. The University has also started free courses to the interested persons in the nearby areas in military training to enable them to compete for national tests, shooting range and music to hone their talent. The University has also started imparting free online competitive examination like NEET preparatory classes. To begin with, theses classes are opened to 100 students of rural poor who cannot afford such preparatory training.

In addition, the villagers in the nearby areas are also educated and informed about their legal rights through regular legal aid clinics. These practices of reaching out to the community and rural papulation, especially women and disadvantaged sections are the essential components of the academic activities of the University. The University on a routine basis carries out other activities in the villages through its Directorate of Community Services. For example, the

farmers, in particular the marginal and small farmers are being educated and informed about the new and the latest technologies including High Yielding Variety (HYV) seeds and standard agroeconomic practices to boost their agricultural production and livelihoods. These activities have yield rich dividends as is evident from a very high increase, nearly of 35 per cent in their annual income.

On the auspicious occasion of completion of 75 years of Indian independence "**आजादी का अमृत महोत्सव**", the University has extended its approach from 22 to 75 villages and 75 blocks in 12 districts of Himachal Pradesh in association with Himalayan *Mahila Avum Jan Kalyan Sanstha* (NGO). Various Research and Development, Innovation, entrepreneurship and Community Development activities have been undertaken in these 75 villages with the active involvement of local communities. The Directorate of Community Services, CPUH has also received a Letter of Appreciation for its products made under the aegis of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan that are included in the basket presented to Hon'ble President of India during the Diamond Jubilee Celebration event held at IIT Delhi on September, 2022.

The University has taken an initiative under National Level Yoga Awareness Drive "Har Ghar Yog" where in the University has adopted a Panchayat-Kharwar of Tehsil Bhoranj, District Hamirpur (H.P.), India. The faculty members regularly visit all households in the adopted

Panchayat to educate villagers about the basic *Yoga Asanas* to which there has been an overwhelming response. In addition, to celebrates enthusiastically *International Yoga Day* on 21st June every year, the University starts a two-month long training camps on *Yoga and Traditional Medicines* in which the participants in online/offline modes are taught different *Yoga Asanas* and the use of traditional medicines in keeping good health. The participants in these regular training sessions come from the whole state and also from out of the state.



Our University is located in backward rural area, where the literacy level is very low. The University is making all efforts to encourage the parents to send their children to the University for higher education. In each year we are able to attract students from such families, who are sending their children for the first time. As per our record, in academic session 2022-23 out 391 graduate students on roll, 117 come from such families and are, therefore, first-generation graduate students.
